Joseph Leahy of Baltimore County, in the State of Maryland being in perfect health of body and mind and disposing mind without any and understanding. Considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time they are being desirous to settle my worldly affairs and thereby to the better provide to leave my dear wife when it shall please God to call me home do therefore make and publish this my last will and testament in manners and forms following that is to say. First and principally I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, and my body to the earth to be decently buried, and after my debts (that I shall leave any) and funeral charges are paid, I devise and bequeath as follows.

Whereas my daughter Eliza has been living with me and in consideration of the services she may render me. I will and bequeath to her and her heirs all my household and kitchen furniture and in further consideration of the services of my said daughter Eliza, I will and bequeath to my Son-in-law Peter Claudus of the City of Baltimore the sum of One thousand dollars, in trust to be placed at interest with such interest he shall pay annually to my said daughter Eliza during her natural life but in the event of her marrying and leaving issue at her death. I do hereby direct and it is my will, that the said issue shall have the said One thousand dollars but should she die leaving no issue then & in that case the said One thousand dollars shall form a part of the residue of my Estate.

Item I devise and bequeath all the rest and residue of my Estate both Real and Personal to be equally divided among my Sons John Joseph, Samuel the Wife of Abner Coats, Catharine the Wife of Charles Gildea and Anna the Wife of Cornelius Sullivan and their heirs in equal portions share and share alike. It is however my will and I do hereby direct that the distributive share that may come to my said daughter Catharine the Wife of Charles Gildea shall be placed in the hands of my Son John in trust to be distributed to my said daughter under his direction as her necessities & those of her children may require.

Item I will and direct that after my decease my Executor hereinafter named shall sell all my real and personal property not otherwise devised either at public or private sale as in the Judgment may be thought best.

Item It is my will and I do hereby direct that my Executor hereinafter named shall have executed and show force around my grave with those of my deceased Wife & Children.

And I do hereby constitute and appoint my Son-in-law Peter Claudus to be the Executor of this my last will and testament making & annulling all former wills by me heretofore made ratifying and confirming this and giving effect to be my last will & testament.

In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this third day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty three.

This is my will and will do give to my daughter Eliza a note that I M. Glantier of hands also 5 note of Francis W. Chag of one hundred dollars with making 5 hundred and this note of M. Glantier amount of 6 hundred & 67 dollars

And this note I give over to M. Glantier for Eliza Meaton for her services to me and Eliza Meaton to half the interest of this money by M. Glantier yearly for a so and if she have the money and have every year the money she to have at three each and if not money and at her death the money she to my wife
